Radiation Exposure Compensation Act

(RECA) Claim

The Radiation Exposure Compensation Act

is a federal program that offers financial compensation to individuals who suffer from specific illnesses tied to radioactive waste exposures from the Manhattan Project.

The program was reauthorized this year and expanded to include individuals living or working in parts of St. Louis City, St. Louis County, and St. Charles County.

Individuals must have been physically present in an affected community for at least two years after January 1, 1949, and

later diagnosed with a specified disease.

There is a survivor benefit to eligible family members of radiation-exposed individuals who passed away from a covered illness and meets all the qualifications.

The deadline to file a new claim is December 31, 2027.
